At least three chambers of Lisa
Ausley's four-chamber heart belong to
missions. Lisa is an ordained deacon in
the UMC serving the St. Mark campus
(Crestview, Fla.) of the Niceville UMC.
She is listed on the church's website
as the "go to girl" to help you find
your way to the mission field. As a
teenager, Lisa accepted a calling to

ministry and her sole passion was foreign missions. She didn't realize at the time, that her "calling" would be to encouage and lead lay people in the local church to fields all over the globe. Lisa, herself, has done mission work in Mexico, Costa Rica, Colombia and Spain. For 17 years, she has served on the board of trustees for One Mission Society, a mission sending agency in the Wesleyan tradition.

Lisa has a master's of religion in English Bible from Asbury Theological Seminary and has a passion for teaching inductive Bible study, using a book she co-authored entitled, LifeChanging Bible Study, which is used as a text in Christian colleges and seminaries.

Her favorite role is as wife to the Rev. Rurel Ausley, lead pastor at the Niceville UMC. The Ausleys have three adult sons whom Lisa homeschooled: Matthew (who was the parsonage baby at Aldersgate UMC in 1983–84), a law student; Andrew, an engineer in Atlanta; and Luke, an engineering student at the University of Central Florida.

Dick McClain became president and chief executive officer of The Mission Society in September 2009. He is the longest-tenured member of the staff, having been its first director of missionary personnel in 1986. He has served as vice president for mission ministry, vice president for church ministry, vice president for mission

operations, and executive vice president and chief operating officer.

Dick has been a part of the growth of The Mission Society from eight staff and 14 missionaries to a ministry that today encompasses more than 200 missionaries who serve in 35 countries, as well as collaborative efforts with numerous churches and Christian organizations around the world.

The son and grandson of missionaries, Dick was born in China and grew up in India and Hong Kong. Prior to joining the staff of The Mission Society, he served as the youth minister for an interdenominational congregation in the Panama Canal Zone. An ordained United Methodist minister, he served pastorates in West Michigan for 11 years. His international ministry has taken him to numerous countries in the Caribbean, Central and South America, Africa, Asia and Europe.

Dick has a bachelor's degree in psychology from Asbury College and a master's of divinity with special emphasis in missions from Asbury Theological Seminary. He married his college sweetheart, Pam, and the couple has three married children: Josh (and Amita), Heather McClain Wilson (and Steve), and Joey (and Ashley). They also have six grandchildren.
