## Rev. Dr. David Thompson



Dr. David Thompson is originally from Kansas City, Missouri, the son of an Italian immigrant (Josie) and a Methodist Pastor (O. L. Thompson). He attended the University of Alabama where he received a BA in Theater Arts and a MA and PhD in Education Administration. He served 7 years as a high school speech and drama teacher as well as the debate team coach. His debate teams earned over \$250,000 in college scholarships and won the State Championship twice. He later went on to coach the University of Alabama Debate team, winning the National Championship once with over 800 two-man teams competing. He found his most rewarding work as an elementary school principal, and many of the stories found in his book come from kids and college students. He retired and went through the Course of Study at Emory University, serving as a United Methodist Minister for 18 years, 7 of those years preaching on the beach in Destin, Florida. He is involved in the Kairos Prison Ministry and teaches Celebrate Recovery in one of the prisons in Florida. Dr. Thompson recently wrote a book entitled "You Did Something Good": Stories of Unconscious Love By The Least of These" available on Amazon.com. He currently lives in Destin with his wife of 44 years, Karen Field Thompson. They have a

## Wesley Heirs Organized in AWF

The following is an article posted in the "United Methodist Christian Advocate" on December 18, 1983.

The name, "Wesley Heirs," was approved for the retired ministers and wives of the Alabama West Florida Conference when they met October 24-25 at Blue Lake.

At the groups' breakfast meeting on May 24, at Huntingdon College, the suggestion was made that a meeting be held between Annual Conference Sessions to provide more time to be together and to share in a vital fellowship. The Conference Historical Society, sponsor of the Breakfast, proceeded to plan accordingly.

The Rev. Robert Hall, Chairperson of the Historical Society, was present for opening session for the October meeting and led in the election of officers. Those elected were: President, Ray and Katherine Whatley; Vice President, Charles and Marjorie Hildreth; Secretary-Treasurer, Welton and Sarah Gregory; Newsletter Editor, Doris Marietta. The Executive Committee was instructed to select a name for the organization and make plans for the year ahead, subject to the approval of the body.

The name, "Wesley Heirs," was approved and all in attendance were named charter members. The chosen motto – "Love, Learn and Live" succinctly expresses what has been and still is the dominant spirit of the members.

The two days were filled with a variety of activities – business sessions, visiting, walking in the woods, and table games. Morning devotions were led by Arthur Carlton and J. Wilson Smack.

The next meeting of the Wesley Heirs is scheduled for March 27-28, 1984 at Oakwood Lodge.
